**Nationalities subject to visa or e-visa: nationals of all other countries can obtain their e-visa online or at Senegalese embassies and consulates.**

**How to obtain your visa \***

Online E-Visa procedure: Since 2013, Senegal has made it compulsory for travelers of nationalities that are not exempt (see list above) to obtain a biometric visa. The visa procedure takes place in two stages. First, payment of the visa and issuance fee must be made via the dedicated website ([www.visasenegal.sn](http://www.visasenegal.sn)). A certain amount of information must be provided online.

Once this formality has been completed, a visit to a diplomatic representation equipped to issue biometric visas is required. There, you will undergo a strict check of all documents and supporting evidence, as well as the taking of a digital photo and fingerprints.

Depending on the consulate and busy periods, formalities can be lengthy. You should therefore allow a full day to obtain your visa. Travelers are therefore advised to check in detail which documents are required for visa issuance, especially if you live several hundred kilometers from a Senegalese diplomatic representation. By way of derogation, any passenger requiring a visa to enter Senegal who, for various reasons, is unable to pre-register at a Senegalese embassy or consulate, or online ([www.visasenegal.sn](http://www.visasenegal.sn)), can board the plane with his or her pre-visa, and be issued a BIOMETRIC VISA at the airports (Léopold Sédar Senghor, Cap Skirring), where he or she will undergo the normal embassy procedure (fingerprinting, submission of documents and supporting evidence, photos, etc.).

Standard embassy procedure: if you are not eligible for e-visa, or if the type of visa you wish to obtain cannot be obtained via the e-visa procedure, you can go to the nearest Senegalese diplomatic representation with the necessary documents.
