**Meet and Greet Breakfast on Movement to End Female Genital Mutilation  
Gwayi Room**

Delegates are invited to a meet-and-greet breakfast with renowned activist and Nobel Nominee Jaha Dukureh. Jaha is the founder of Safe Hands for Girls, a nonprofit organisation working to protect young women and girls who are at risk of female genital mutilation (FGM). For her outstanding work on women's rights and advocating against FGM, she was named TIME Magazine's 100 Most Influential People for 2016, was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2018, and was called one of the 100 most influential Africans of 2017 by New African magazine. The discussion will cover the status of the Pan-African movement against FGM, with a specific deep dive into The Gambia, where the country's National Assembly recently voted to reject a bill which would've overturned the nation's historic ban on the practice.
